He also teaches ethics at Columbia Journalism School, where he is adjunct professor and Senior Advisor for Academic Affairs. His books include "Shaking the Foundations: 200 Years of Investigative Journalism in America" and "Legal Lynching: The Death Penalty and America's Fut

Elana Newman, Ph.D. is the McFarlin Professor of Psychology and Affiliate Faculty in Media Studies at the University of Tulsa and Research Director and a co-founder of the Dart Center for Journalism and Trauma. Newman's research examines a wide range of topics such as physical and psychological effects of trauma exposure; trauma and health care costs, journalism, occupational health, correctional issues, and substance abuse; and research ethics in studying trauma survivors.
